You can take courses in Community Education, Sign Language Interpretation, or Cultural Management at Humak UAS. We do not offer Cultural Management on-campus studies in the autumn term.

In addition to modules, you can choose courses from optional studies. You can also choose courses from other fields of study if they are relevant to your degree and your institution approves them. Erasmus courses are carried out in English.

Course enrollment period

Autumn and spring semester:

Enrolment period: starting the registration from the 1st of April for the whole incoming academic year, usually the enrollments end two weeks before the course starts

Language requirements

Incoming students are recommended to have level B2 in English on the CEFR scale. Humak requires the proof of English proficiency Minimum B2 (official language test certificate or English teacher's statement is required from students who study in a non-English language degree programme and are not native speakers of English)

It is also the home institution's responsibility to ensure that students' language skills are sufficient for an exchange period abroad.

Assessment scale

The courses and the final theses that are assessed numerically will be assessed at four levels within a scale from 5 to 0 as follows:

- Excellent (5)
 - Good (3-4)
 - Satisfactory (1-2)
 - Failed (0)
- Note:** At Humak, some courses are assessed on a Pass/Fail basis. Exchange students who require a numerical grade (0–5) for their home university must inform the teacher at the beginning of each course.

Transcript of Records (ToR)

Students are responsible for downloading the Transcripts of Records themselves from the student's administration system Peppi.

A Transcript of Records will be issued by Humak no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished.

***Notification:** If you are attending a continuous course that lasts for two semesters and would like to receive your grade and credits after the first semester, please inform the lecturer already at the beginning of the course. Otherwise, your grade and credits might be awarded after the course has been completed at the end of the second semester.*
